 a. Paying for training in cash b. Showing interest in only certain areas of training but not others necessary for certification. 	
 c. Suddenly leaving a training program without explanation d. Any activity that appears suspicious or inconsistent with the intent to obtain full certification 	
e. Individuals on the airport property without apparent reason be theref. Persons who desire to rent aircraft without proper credentials	
 g. Persons with proper credentials who don't display a corresponding level of aviation knowledge or skill 	
h. Any pilot who makes threats or statements inconsistent with normal aircraft operations	
i. Any activity inconsistent with the normal activity of the airport j. Any pilot who appears to be under the control of someone else	
Additionally, Colorado Flight Center Staff members will be continuously vigilant to ensure:	
a. Aircraft are not dispatched without proper authorization	
 b. Secured doors, access points, etc. remain locked c. Persons without proper access identifications are immediately reported to airport security 	
Staff members will immediately report suspicious activities to the flight school manager, airport authority, or law enforcement as they deem necessary.
